#### **Project Overview**

The City of Spring Hill seeks funding from the U.S. Department of Transportation for funding available through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program for their City of Spring Hill - SS4A Implementation Grant Application Project which includes implementation and supplemental activities outlined in the recently completed Spring Hill Comprehensive Safety Action Plan.

This opportunity is a discretionary BIL program with a local match requirement of 20% of the total project cost. The entity is requesting \$1,949,957.00 from the Build Kansas Fund, and is providing a local match of \$102,630.00. This request has the potential to unlock \$8,210,349.00 in federal funds, for a total project cost of \$10,262,936.00.

The deadline is June 26, 2025, and this Build Kansas Fund application was received on May 30, 2025.

	To ensure the long-term viability and successful implementation of this project, the City has actively tried to identify and secure matching funds for this project. But we have been unable to obtain the full match amount due to current budget constraints and limited availability of eligible funding sources. The City has explored potential match amounts through local funding; however, the required match amount exceeds our financial capacity. We are unable to allocate additional resources without jeopardizing other essential services and are respectfully requesting consideration from the Build Kansas Fund to help fund this important safety project for Spring Hill.

### **Budget – SS4A Implementation Grant Application**

#### Introduction

In June 2025, the City of Spring Hill adopted its Spring Hill Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP) to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries. The Spring Hill CSAP (2025) identified the city's high-injury network (HIN) and high-risk network (HRN), where over 80% of fatal and injury crashes occur, accounting for only 25% of the roadway miles in the area.

These safety improvements will enhance the safety and mobility of all modes of transportation, particularly for pedestrians, ensuring that all streets in Spring Hill are safer for everyone, from schoolchildren to seniors. Implementing these projects will enable the City of Spring Hill to enhance connectivity, walkability, and safety. Thereby, significantly contributing to the overall quality of life and promoting an active and secure environment for all.

#### Safe Streets for Spring Hill – Safety Improvements

Spring Hill plans to implement improvements at the following intersections and corridors:

- Access Management
  - US-169/K-7 & Lone Elm
  - o US-169/K-7 & 207<sup>th</sup> Street
  - US-169/K-7 & 215<sup>th</sup> Street
- Roundabout
  - Ridgeview Road & 191<sup>st</sup> Street
  - o Ridgeview Road & 207th Street
  - o 223<sup>rd</sup> Street and Victory Road
- Sidewalk
  - o South Street from 215<sup>th</sup> Street to Webster Road

### Safe Streets for Spring Hill – Supplemental Projects

The supplemental activities will conceptualize new corridor cross-sections and determine strategies to build bike and pedestrian networks, utilizing public input for guidance. This includes the following activities:

- Complete Streets Framework Plan
- Bicycle and Pedestrian Network Plan

### **Funding Request**

The City of Spring Hill is requesting **\$8,210,349** in Federal funds as part of this request. The City of Spring Hill has committed **\$2,052,587** in funding as the required non-Federal match for the project (20% of the total Federal funds request).

The total project cost for the City of Spring Hill Implementation Grant Application is **\$10,262,936.**
